We can't do it alone





WHAT WILL BE REQUIRED OF ME?

There is no fee to participate but we do ask for a minimal time commitment required prior to a disaster for training and exercise purposes. These commitments may be delegated to multiple representatives within your company, and include completing training and quarterly meetings.

In a disaster situation, business partners serve in either a physical or virtual BEOC.
