

HOW DO I GET INVOLVED

- Work with your Block Captain
- Bring new neighbors into the pro-gram

Follow these simple security precautions:

- Use your eyes and ears and then your telephone.
- If you spot something suspicious call Law Enforcement immediately
- Get to know your Neighbors.
- Exchange phone numbers, types of cars, and any other pertinent information with your neighbors.
- Let a neighbor know when you are going to be away from home.
- ☐ Make sure your home is secured when you leave even if it is for only a short while.
- Watch for suspicious people or cars hanging around the neighborhood.
- Keep the Block Captain informed as to crime incidents that occurred in your home, that you have witnessed or any reason related to security that you have called the police for.

REMEMBER

Law Enforcement Officers can't be everywhere at once.

- But you and your neighbors can.
- Put that neighborhood "know how" to work.

WHAT IS IT?

Neighborhood Watch is a crime prevention program that enlists the active participation of residents in cooperation with law enforcement to reduce crime in their communities.

- Residents trained to recognize and report suspicious activities in their neighborhoods
- Implementation of crime prevention techniques such as home security, operation identification, etc.
